Stepping Forward Together: 500 Shoes for our Sponsored Children

On October 17, we provided 500 pairs of shoes to primary students at Tibaquin Elementary School in our Pugad Tibaguin-Hagonoy, Bulacan development area, including our sponsored children.

This initiative was part of our collaboration with SM Store Marilao for the "Share Shoes" campaign, celebrating the centennial birth anniversary of SM's founder, Henry "Tatang" Sy Sr. SM Store volunteers, led by SM Retail's Zone Marketing Head Ms. Arvie Ong and Marilao Branch Manager Ms. Verlyn Diaz, helped distribute these gifts and inspire the children. Each pair of shoes represents dignity, confidence, and future possibilities.





Strengthening Partnerships for Good Change



Sitio Bakal in Bagong Silangan, Quezon City, has long faced challenges in accessing clean water, compounded by recurring flooding, especially during typhoons. To address these critical issues, Good Neighbors Philippines, in partnership with Megawide Corporate Foundation Inc., installed a Rainwater Catchment Facility as a sustainable solution for water access and flood mitigation.

This ensures a reliable source of clean water for sanitation and daily use at the Sitio Bakal Daycare Center.

The facility collects and filters rainwater, transforming it into a safe, usable resource while also diverting excess water during heavy rains to reduce flood risks. By integrating sustainable water management with climate adaptation, this project not only meets the community's immediate needs but also strengthens long-term resilience.

This is part of the ECOSKWELA Project which also includes climate adaptation education for the community members.

Building Climate Resilience for Sustainable Farming

Good Neighbors Philippines continues to advance climate resilience in Laak, Davao de Oro, where *small-scale* banana farmers face persistent challenges due to extreme weather events. Since the establishment of the Laak Field Office and the introduction of climate-resilient banana varieties, significant progress has been made in equipping farmers with sustainable solutions.

The retrofitted tissue culture laboratory has successfully produced and distributed resilient plantlets, while the Farmer Field School (FFS) has expanded its reach, training more farmers in climate-smart techniques to improve productivity and sustainability.

Early results from the Demo Farm Field confirm that these initiatives are helping farmers stabilize their yields despite droughts and floods. By reducing dependency on chemical fertilizers and adopting sustainable farming practices, farmers have also lowered production costs and strengthened food security in their communities.

Economic Empowerment for Marginalized Breadwinners

Good Neighbors Philippines is equipping breadwinners in Bagong Silangan and Sitio Bakal with the tools to overcome unemployment and underemployment through skills training, financial assistance, and job placement support centered on motorcycle-based livelihoods.

On November 26–27, 2025, participants completed intensive riding and safety lessons in partnership with the MMDA's Motorcycle Riding Academy and the Honda Safety Driving Center. After acquiring licenses, they will access individual loans through community savings groups—making motorcycle ownership and employment more attainable.

Motorcycles are more than just vehicles, they're income generators. This initiative empowers youth, women, and heads of households who have long shouldered the responsibility of providing for their families. With proper training and affordable financing, they now have the chance to secure jobs or start businesses.

We are also working with ride-hailing, delivery, and tourism industries to provide employment pathways for graduates, ensuring long-term income and economic mobility. By opening doors to dignified work, this intervention fosters stability and a stronger future for marginalized communities.

The Community Livelihood Recovery Support (CLRS) Program continues to provide low-interest loans to farmers, fisherfolk, and small and medium enterprises (SMEs), helping them to regain stability after disasters.

Since the program's launch in early 2022, we've supported 250 farmers and 120 fisherfolk, enabling them to increase their monthly net income by 40 to 60 percent. More than 180 small and medium enterprises (SMEs) have also accessed financial assistance, fueling the growth of local businesses. Women play a vital role in this life-long recovery. With skills training and financial support, they are starting their own businesses and contributing significantly to their families' financial stability.

When Typhoon Odette struck Bohol on December 16, 2021, it destroyed homes and wiped out livelihoods. In response, we immediately launched an emergency relief operation in January 2022, providing shelter kits to 200 displaced families. Good Neighbors Philippines continues with long-term, inclusive support. By revitalizing key industries and ensuring broad economic participation, we are building stronger and more resilient communities—one livelihood at a time.

Protecting Women and Children: The Impact of the iCARE Hub

The iCARE (Inclusive Community that is Aware, Responsive, and Engaged in Children's Protection) Hub in Prieto Diaz, Sorsogon, is a child protection project focused on strengthening case management of abuse cases in the locality. It is a safe, child-friendly space where survivors can access critical services, including medical care, legal assistance, psychosocial support, and mental health counseling.

By bringing together professionals from the Philippine National Police, Municipal Health Office, and Social Welfare Office, the hub ensures a coordinated and survivor-centered response. This approach makes the process of seeking help more accessible and compassionate and spares victims from the burden of visiting multiple offices, reducing further trauma.

The project started in June 2021 and was turned over last February 2023. Together with the local stakeholders and volunteers, the ICARE Project improved the awareness of the community about the importance of children's rights, and the mechanism of reporting and referring abuse cases towards women and children.

Through its efforts to strengthen the local protection system, Good Neighbors Philippines is fostering a safer environment for women and children—one where they are heard, supported, and empowered to reclaim their future.

After Typhoon Carina devastated Sitio Bakal in July 2024, Good Neighbors Philippines provided construction materials to help families like that of Dolores Rubio rebuild their homes. Dolores also received groceries to restart her small store and kitchen tools to meet daily needs.

This intervention restored both shelter and livelihood, helping the family recover faster from the disaster. Their experience reflects the broader reality in Sitio Bakal—a creekside community where flooding is a constant threat. When Typhoon Carina hit, the combination of heavy rains and rising waters swept through the area, destroying homes, livelihoods, and daily essentials.

Medical Missions for Post-Typhoon Health Recovery in Catanduanes

On December 11–12, 2024, Good Neighbors Philippines conducted a medical mission in Barangay Sioron, Gigmoto, in partnership with the Catanduanes Medical Society and local barangay units. Residents received medical consultations, free medicines, vitamins, and health education sessions on disease prevention.

These efforts addressed urgent health concerns in the aftermath of Super Typhoon Pepito, protecting families from respiratory infections and waterborne diseases.

By standing with our communities before, during, and after disasters, we ensure that families not only survive but thrive—because a healthy community is a resilient one.

Providing Clean Water and Safe Sanitation in Schools

Through Good Neighbors Philippines' WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) Program, a four-seater communal toilet was built, the water system was rehabilitated, and a water pumping station was constructed at Tubabao National High School in Guiuan, Eastern Samar. We also conducted WASH education to ensure proper hygiene practices and long-term facility maintenance. Today, the project benefits over 200 students and teachers, and 500 community members in the area.

For more than a decade, students—especially girls—had no access to clean water and safe sanitation, forcing them to walk 165 meters into a forested area just to relieve themselves. This not only compromised their health and safety but also disrupted their education and dignity.

Now, with access to clean water and safe, dignified sanitation, students can focus on learning and shaping their future. Tubabao is just one of the many communities we are working to uplift.

Advancing Maternal and Child Nutrition in Guiuan, Eastern Samar

Through a focused community-led intervention, Good Neighbors Philippines launched the Demand Generation for Optimal Maternal and Child Nutrition Practices Project in November 2024 in Guiuan, Eastern Samar to combat malnutrition and empower families with better nutrition practices. The project aimed to improve maternal and child nutrition through Social Behavior Change Communication (SBCC), hands-on training, and grassroots health initiatives.

We trained 493 local health workers, exceeding our original target, and organized 130 women-led advocacy groups to promote lasting behavior change in their communities. As a result, more than 62,634 individuals gained access to improved health knowledge and services, creating a ripple effect of awareness and action.

This project didn't just raise awareness, it mobilized communities, strengthened health systems, and empowered women to lead.

Last December 14, 2024, 10 parents from the Prieto Diaz Community Development Project (PD CDP) and 86 beneficiaries of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) in Sorsogon completed the Project Lotus 3.0 training. In partnership with Sorsogon State University (SorSU), this 10-week program equipped parents with practical strategies to support their children's literacy development at home. The program helped parents build positive reading habits and integrate them into their daily family routines.

Project Lotus 3.0 is a key part of the TEACH (Together Engaging Active Collaboration for Helping Children Read and Learn) Project led by Good Neighbors Philippines in Prieto Diaz. Through the Prieto Diaz Community Development Project, TEACH helps address early reading challenges by providing digital learning tools, training for parents, and community-based support. Many children in the area still struggle with basic reading skills, especially after the learning disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Parents trained under Project Lotus 3.0 will now mentor other families through monthly learning sessions, helping spread what they've learned to the wider community. By giving both children and parents the tools to support education at home, the TEACH Project continues to build stronger, more inclusive learning environments in Prieto Diaz—showing that when families are empowered, children learn better.





Building the Next Generation of Change-makers Through the Scholarship Program

Through our Scholarship Program, 100 students from underprivileged families were supported in secondary and tertiary education. They received financial assistance throughout the academic year, along with personal development support to help them grow into confident, capable leaders.

Among these scholars is Shine from Sagrada Familia in Hagonoy, Bulacan. Raised in a coastal community often affected by poverty and flooding, she once believed higher education was beyond her reach. But in 2024, Shine was a second-year Entrepreneurship student at Bulacan State University and an active Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) councilor. She leads youth programs and advocates for education in her barangay—proof of what's possible when young people are given the support they deserve.

Her story is just one example of the many youth change-makers we are empowering through education.



By supporting students like Shine, we are not only providing access to learning but also nurturing a generation ready to lead, serve, and transform their communities.
