

Through this, Youth WAVE: Festival of Talents was developed with the theme "Celebrating Diversity Through Inclusive Community." This festival provided a platform for youth and their communities to showcase their unique talents and promote the rich culture of their municipality.

The festival of talents was participated by 10 secondary schools in the Community Development Project (CDP) areas of Tingloy, Batangas; Guiuan, Eastern Samar; and Prieto Diaz, Sorsogon.

This talent competition has anchored the youth's talents in advocating inclusive and responsive communities and encouraged them to express their skills and talents with confidence and trust in themselves.

Just like Robelle, a scholar and one of the representatives for the Youth WAVE, who showed inspiration to her fellow youth by being an empowered and talented youth.

I encourage my fellow youth to use our talents and skills in uplifting each other, supporting one another, amplifying each other's voices, and working together because, through these small efforts, we can achieve big ripple effects in our community.

## New Beginnings for Out-of-School Youths

Despite rising enrollment in recent years, the Philippines faces a high dropout rate. According to a 2023 report by Philippine Business for Education, one in four Junior High School students drop out before Senior High School, primarily due to lack of personal interest and insufficient family income.

To address this, the *Opportunity 2.0 (O2 Program) of the United States Agency for International Development or USAID was granted to Good Neighbors Philippines*. This program supports Out-of-School Youths (OSY) in Sitio Bakal Community Development Project (CDP) in Bagong Silangan to start anew, improve their education, and strengthen their capacity for livelihood opportunities.

The O2 Program is a collaborative program designed to strengthen existing systems of improving the education, employment, and livelihood outcomes of Filipino out-of-school youth (OSY) by 2025.

Through this program, 94 OSYs completed the program and were assisted to their chosen tracks – continuing education, employability, and entrepreneurship. 10 learners completed their vocational courses under the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and 34 youth entrepreneurs finished their training with QC Pangkabuhayan under the Small and Cooperatives Promotion Office. They were awarded an initial business capital of 20,000 pesos to start their business. There were 15 work and education-ready learners who have successfully enrolled at the Quezon City University and Alternative Learning System in Bagong Silangan.

Additionally, 33 learners attended a work immersion activity in partnership with CHA Realty Corporation and the Public Employment Service Office in Quezon City to improve their working skills and increase their awareness of the work environment.

# Protecting Children Against Abuse and Exploitation

The escalating number of child abuse cases, recorded at least 17,600 in 2023 according to the Philippine National Police, is very alarming and disheartening. As a humanitarian development organization, ensuring that children are protected from any form of violence and abuse is Good Neighbors' commitment.

Good Neighbors Philippines strives to protect the rights of every child through various programs and projects that fulfill and safeguard their rights.

To raise awareness about child abuse and exploitation, Good Neighbors Philippines developed a video about child protection, which was shared with our communities. This aims to educate and inform community members that help is available and preventive actions are essential to protect children from any form of abuse.

The organization also advocates and practices "zero tolerance" for any form of sexual exploitation and abuse, as we uphold the best interests of the community and children. An existing policy on Protection on Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA) is enforced to ensure safety of vulnerable groups, especially children.

These efforts and actions to protect children are crucial, but at large scale, we can only protect what is within our control. It might be discouraging but collective actions are important for protection.

In one of the project areas, justice was served for a child who was abused. Good Neighbors Philippines supported and guided the family in the case, particularly in reporting the incidents to the proper authorities and financial assistance.



# **Improving Health Access in Remote Communities**

Sitio Bakal, an isolated community in highly urbanized Metro Manila, is deprived of basic access to health services. To reach a health center or hospital, residents must begin with a 30-minute walk on narrow, unpaved, or half-paved paths that are inaccessible to 4-wheeled vehicles. Only after this grueling walk can they access public transportation to a health facility. During emergencies, critical transportation to and from the community is a constant challenge.

In partnership with Sun Life Foundation, Good Neighbors Philippines initiated the BRIDGE (Building Resilience through Inter-Health Development and Greater Education) Project. It provided 2,975 residents of Sitio Bakal and Sitio Ibayo with better access to healthcare, including an ambulance tricycle for rapid emergency response.

Moreover, they were provided with a solar-powered public address system for health information awareness, and capacity building workshops to teach community members health referral pathways, first aid, and basic life support. Health awareness campaigns were also implemented through safe motherhood childhood seminars, adolescent sexual and reproductive health education, and physical fitness activities.

# **Improving Safe Access to Clean Water in Schools**

In remote areas, like Gigmoto, Catanduanes and Guiuan, Eastern Samar, inadequate water supply poses a challenge to the community, affecting children the hardest. They face lack of access to clean water, insufficient toilets, inadequate hand washing facilities, and poor sanitation and hygiene in their schools.

Good Neighbors Philippines' water, sanitation and hygiene program ensures water sources and clean water in the communities. When water sources are available and improved, people can be productive in other ways, since they will spend less time collecting water.

In Gigmoto, 7 sanitary toilets and 13 handwashing facilities were constructed and rehabilitated. These facilities serve 2,363 children and 106 teachers in nine elementary schools.

A new water reservoir and elevated water tank, handwashing facility, and toilets were constructed *benefitting 200 students at Tubabao National High School in Guiuan, Eastern Samar.* 



We are very thankful for the this provision because we will no longer use well water and rain water for our handwashing, toilets, and even for watering the plants in our school.

## **Bringing New Transport Services** to the Underserved Communities



The Prieto Diaz-Gubat-Sorsogon City Transport Service Cooperative (PGUSORTSCO) is the sole transport cooperative in Prieto Diaz, Sorsogon, and as of 2022, they were still operating old jeepny units. In light of the government's modernization program, these older jeepneys face replacement due to safety concerns of the passengers because of inadequate maintenance, adverse environmental impacts and slow local economic movement. These issues particularly affect the vulnerable children and families within the community.

Good Neighbors Philippines, through its Economic Development program, helped these jeepney drivers who do not have the capital to join the modernization program and provided them two units of modern jeepneys. This aims to improve the quality and accessibility of public transportation of the community, offering an environment-friendly transportation options, while also boosting economic movement.

TOTAL ECONOMIC IMPACT VALUE ADDED TO TRANSPORT SERVICE COOPERATIVES IN PRIETO DIAZ AND GUIUAN

The modernized jeepney units now serve *more than 22,000 individuals, especially students and local vendors that frequently travel* to Gubat, which is the center market of other neighboring municipalities including Prieto Diaz, where many public and private colleges and high schools are located. Additionally, the *60 cooperative members will receive capacity-building, savings and credit training, policy making, and other organizational development training that will help them increase their management skills.*

# Providing Better Economic Opportunities to Fisherfolks

Hagonoy, Bulacan covers almost 8,000 hectares exclusive to fish farming with 1,423 fishpond operators and 55 registered consignments, offering a diverse range of harvest. However, the control and imposition on interests of commercial banks and microfinance institutions discourages fisherfolks from making long-term investments, severely impacting their livelihoods.

On May 18, 2022, Good Neighbors Philippines solidified a partnership with Hagonoy Fish Farmers Producers

Cooperative (HFFPC), providing a 3.9M investment assistance to strengthen economic opportunities in the community. This collaboration resulted in a better livelihood environment in Bulacan.

Over a span of more than two years, Good Neighbors Philippines' diligently supported HFFPC through entrepreneurship skills training, co-facilitation of pre-membership education seminars, and monitoring of its development.

The committed service of HFFPC provides valuable benefits for its 212 veteran small-scale fishpond owners and fishermen, increasing their income while maintaining competitive pricing amidst rising cost of materials.

Commencing operations in July 2023 with just two municipal branches, HFFPC progressively established their presence. They received invitations to supply additional branches in the neighboring province of Nueva Ecija.

The fruits of these endeavors scale-up their sales revenues, totaling approximately 6.4 million pesos, or nearly 320,000 pesos weekly, in less than six months. This enables the cooperatives and fish farmers to transform their economic landscape and lay better foundations for the future of their children.



The HFFPC was directly vending freshly harvested sea goods to consumers every Friday to Sunday, during Market Days or Bagsakan Days, across four WalterMart locations in Bulacan.

# Building Financial Independence of Women in the Community

In Rodriguez, Rizal, a group of women and men banded together to increase their economic capabilities. The Bambanin Savings Group, established in 2018 with just 29 members, committed themselves to saving as little as 100 pesos per month.

Good Neighbors Philippines, through Micro Business Pandemic Loan (MBPL), supported Bambanin's aspiration to improve their families' livelihoods. They availed a loan to invest in the expansion of their store operations. Through consistent and responsible repayments, they earned the trust to access a larger loan of 150,000 pesos, which they strategically invested in expanding their rice retailing business. They are currently well-positioned in their community having four commodity businesses in their community.

Driven by their desire to succeed, the group actively pursued capacity-building initiatives facilitated by Good Neighbors

Philippines including seminars on values formation, leadership training, financial management, and marketing strategy formulation.

The Bambanin Savings Group epitomizes accountability and responsibility within the organization. Notably, they also champion women empowerment, with 46 out of 61 members being women, and one of them, Jocelyn Rustia, serving as the Vice President.

We are grateful to be entrusted by Good Neighbors with a loan. It immensely helped to establish our own business. It has also provided jobs for our members who served as employees in our store. We also appreciate all the seminars they conducted to improve our knowledge and skills even if we were unable to finish school. Through their tutelage, we were able to promptly manage and pay off our loan.

# Innovative Solutions for Banana Farmer's Climate Adaptation

The impact of climate change worsens the situation of the agriculture sector, resulting in severe loss of agricultural production and food insecurity in the Philippines. Farmers, especially banana farmers, are continuously affected and challenged by this adverse situation.

In Longanapan, Kilagding, and Aguinaldo Community Development Projects (CDP) in Laak, Davao De Oro, a huge percentage of farmers, including banana farmers, are confronted with various issues that limit their capacity to grow their income and expand their operations. These issues include lack of access to modern technology and innovation, climate change, high production costs, plantations and procure farm inputs, and limited knowledge to propel the banana industry into more viable business opportunities among small-scale farmers.

To address this, Good Neighbors Philippines launched the project "Innovating the Banana Industry through Tissue Culture Laboratory" in Davao de Oro which aims for better access and capacity to innovate and produce high quality planting materials or banana plantlets and varieties and opportunities for smallholder farmers.

Significantly, the tissue culture laboratory and a nursery in Laak CDP have been retrofitted with enhanced infrastructure and latest machinery which allowed banana growers to cultivate banana plantlets for farming and selling. They were also able to replicate disease-free banana tissues and propagate them for local farmers through research and development.

A one-hectare demonstration farm has been identified and utilized for hands-on learning of various farm treatments to help farmers determine strategies best suits their needs.

Moreover, 38 farmers of Laak Farmers Marketing Cooperative (LAMARCO) were trained on climate-smart agriculture which improves practices and mitigates the impact of climate change on their crops. Local education institutions partnerships such as the Davao de Oro State College and Mindanao State University further improve knowledge sharing and skills of farmers and research-practitioners.

This project enables the community to be equipped with better climate change adaptation and also help them reduce their farm input costs, explore other sources of income, and attain higher overall profit.

# **Strengthening Climate Resilience of Rice Farmers**

With the worsening impact of climate change in the Philippines, the situation of families and community farmers are at risk, including low yield of smallholder farmers, who have little to no access to climate knowledge and technologies essential to sustainable agriculture.

To address these issues, strengthening climate resilience has been Good Neighbors Philippines' mission for the communities. The farmers accessed better climate knowledge through the 2022 project titled "Building Resilience through Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation," which provided technologies and capacity building training that helped them mitigate and adapt to climate change.

This project was augmented through the project "Strengthening Climate Resilience of Agricultural Community through Organic Composting." In partnership with the San Clemente Local Government Unit (LGU) in Tarlac and the Central Luzon State University, this project aimed to increase climate resiliency of the agricultural community by reducing agricultural waste through composting or converting it into organic inputs, while also strengthen the capacity of agricultural cooperatives.

Among the interventions of the project was the construction and establishment of full solar-powered organic composting facility, including solar-powered machines that process agricultural wastes or biowastes into organic inputs, capacity building activities on climate resilient approaches in agriculture, and cooperative development training with focus on women empowerment. This project also involved organizing a farmers' cooperative with women-led enterprise development on organic fertilizer marketing.

The farmers' association officially became registered as the San Clemente Farmers Agriculture Cooperative (SCFAC) in October 2022 with the Cooperative Development Authority. The following year, the composting facility was completed and inaugurated, with 52 members promoting organic compost fertilizers as its main business. Additionally, 182 farmers practiced and adopted sustainable techniques on organic farming and composting on their farms through Farmers Field School.



## **Enhancing Disaster Preparedness through Anticipatory Action**

The Philippine archipelago is exposed to a multitude of hazards, particularly in coastal communities in the municipalities of Gigmoto, Catanduanes and Guiuan, Eastern Samar, which are frequently ravaged by extreme typhoons.

During typhoon disasters, the communities often grapple with disrupted communication, threat to economic activities and food insecurity. Their geographic location hinders them from being reached during crises, while the destruction of livelihood leads to economic setbacks and food shortages.

While the impact of disasters is inevitable, preparedness can significantly mitigate these negative effects and save lives. Recognizing this, the *United Nations (UN) Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) introduced the Anticipatory Action framework*. This approach advocates for proactive measures to support communities before crises unfold, thereby reducing disaster losses and protecting vital assets.

In collaboration with the Local Government Units of Gigmoto, Catanduanes, and Guiuan, Eastern Samar, Good Neighbors Philippines has focused on establishing contingency plans to enhance evacuation protocols for vulnerable populations. This involves upgrading emergency communication systems, and safeguarding livelihood equipment such as fishing boats and gear, and supporting transport cooperative.

In Gigmoto, designated safe areas for boat evacuation have been identified for fisherfolk, with the construction and turnover of a boat trailer to the local government. Additionally, a dedicated boat evacuation team has been trained in Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) and basic life support to ensure the security of boats during severe weather disturbances.

On the other hand, in Guiuan, a base radio has been installed to enhance existing communication systems, while portable two-way radio handsets have been distributed to island barangays to ensure connectivity during strong typhoons. Good Neighbors Philippines is also working to complete the installation of radio systems on public utility vehicles operated by transport cooperatives, which can be utilized during emergencies.

## Rebuilding the Hope for Students After Disaster

During Typhoon Odette, the province of *Bohol suffered extensive damage, claiming lives and livelihoods, and impacting various* sectors, including education. The typhoon disrupted the learning of the students and left 4,276 classrooms and other school facilities in havoc, magnifying the challenges faced by the families and communities.

Lapinig Elementary School, located in the island municipality of Pres. Carlos P. Garcia, was hard hit. *The school roofs* were torn off by strong winds, while the stage and handwashing facilities were greatly damaged, rendering the school environment unsafe and unfit for learning.

In response to this urgent need, *Good Neighbors Philippines and the Philippine Disaster Resilience Foundation* (*PDRF*) partnered to restore access to safe and quality education for 155 students and 8 teachers. The focus of the efforts was to rehabilitate the school's stage and hand washing facilities at Lapinig Elementary School, recognizing the critical role these facilities play in post-disaster recovery.

The stage is crucial for the school to hold various functions for its students, fostering a sense of community and engagement. On the other hand, the handwashing facility is immensely helpful to promote proper hygiene

within the school. The newly constructed facilities was commended by the Department of Education and boosted a five-star rating in terms of the public school's overall performance and quality. This recognition underscores the transformative impact of collaborative efforts in rebuilding schools and restoring hope for the students affected by disaster.






